

DAY 1, Monday,

2

Depart EWR, evening flight

Arrive at the beginning location of your domestic flight early. We are seeing all sorts of weather around the country. Today, we will be gathering from across the US heading to EWR to begin our adventure together. The Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage will not be cancelled or rescheduled. Your participation will not be cancelled or rescheduled. If the group is delayed out of EWR, EL AL will get us underway as soon as possible. If you are delayed in arriving at EWR and you miss our flight, EL AL will get you on the next available flight (the next day) and you will catch up with us after your arrival in Israel.

If there are flight delays or other problems on your domestic flight, work with your airline and keep reminding them that you are connecting with an international flight at EWR.

Contact your travel agency or airline directly.

#### At ER Airport:

- Around 6:00 PM begin moving and looking for the group on the DEPARTURES area for EL AL.
- Be sure to check in with us FIRST, before you attempt to check in with EL AL. As is possible, we will check in as a group.
- Our EL AL Flight is near 9:00 p.m. We will start checking in with EL AL and go through their security procedures <u>after</u> 6:00 p.m.
- Join the group as we wait in the queue for check-in.
- You will have an interview process. Have travel documents and passport ready.
- Proceed to the EL AL Desks to check luggage and receive your BOARDING PASS.
- Continue to and through Airport Security with carry-on.
- We will re-gather at the gate area prior to boarding.
- If you arrive after the group has checked in, enter the lines and work through the process individually.

After boarding, get settled in for the long overnight flight (around 10.5 hours).

Once we have taken off, received the airline safety video, etc. we may be served a meal sometime. This will be the lunch you will not receive the next day.

After the meal, lights will be dimmed for 6-7 hours for rest. At the end of that time, the lights will come up and in time, we will be served breakfast. On the ground in Israel it is already mid-afternoon. When we land at Ben Gurion Airport in Tel Aviv it will be around 2:20 PM Israel time.

#### DAY 2, Tuesday,

Arrive Tel Aviv – Ben Gurion Airport

Upon Arriving at Ben Gurion Airport in TEL AVIV (it will be Tuesday afternoon):

There is no way to gather the group at this point. SO - - -

- "Collect ALL of your things and get off the plane (double check your seating area and the luggage compartments).
- " Proceed to the main terminal

(there is only one path, you can't go wrong).

- "Have your passport ready and proceed through the PASSPORT CONTROL stations (you have a <u>Foreign</u> passport).
- "Keep the small slip of paper they give you in your passport.
- "You will use the small slip of paper to enter the main hall (with baggage claim).
- "Keep the small slip of paper in your passport, we will need to collect them when we gather as we are collecting our luggage.
- "Check in with one of your tour hosts.
- " Collect your checked bag from the baggage claim area for your flight.
- " Take a rest room break while you wait and collect your luggage.
- "Gather back with the group and wait patiently while one of the group leaders has checked you off the list.
- " DO NOT LEAVE THE BAGGAGE CLAIM AREA ON YOUR OWN. STAY TOGETHER WITH THE GROUP.
- " We will take the whole group together to the next place (and the bus).
- --Everyone is in charge of getting their own luggage to the bus.
- --We will go to the Tal by the Beach Hotel in Tel Aviv for one night.

#### FIVE IMPORTANT RULES FOR HAPPY GROUP LIFE

- LISTEN (READ) AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS.
- BE ON TIME.
- BE WHERE YOU ARE SUPPOSED TO BE.
- DO WHAT YOU ARE SUPPOSED TO DO.
- KEEP THE LEADERS INFORMED

#### **GUIDELINES**

Please wear your name badge and lanyard throughout the tour. This helps identify you as a part of our tour group and shows courtesy to others. <u>STAY WITH THE GROUP</u>. If you wander away from the tour group and we cannot find you, do your best to negotiate a taxi fare back to the hotel for the rest of the day. We will need to continue that day without you.

#### **ATTITUDES & BEHAVIORS**

Please remember that while on this pilgrimage – you represent the Knights Templar, the United States of America, your denomination, and the Christian faith. The impression you make by your actions, words, and attitudes should reflect positively on who you are, the program, and Christianity.

#### ALSO:

- Watch your step, watch your head.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Keep valuables secure.
- Bathroom breaks (don't wait until it is time to leave)
- Keep the group together (keep the accordion small)
- Do not let others cut through or move into our group.

- Do a self-inventory before you move on. PAUSE, ASSESS, INVENTORY.
- Everyone needs to get that special photo. Always rotate at photo opportunities.
- Use the wrist strap with your camera or any device that has one.

- Get off the bus and take any items you brought onto the bus with you (your bags under the bus will come in later).
- Wait patiently in the lobby until we get keys, etc. in order.
- Room keys and stickers for luggage will be distributed.
- Put the stickers on your luggage and bellboys will take them to your room. Please do not disrupt this process. Bellboys will have access to service elevators and/or carts to move luggage efficiently. If you attempt to take your luggage on the regular elevators yourself, you will significantly slow down the group's ability to get to their rooms in a timely manner.

Take a walk, stretch out, stir the blood a bit. This will help you get to sleep and be prepared for the day tomorrow.

Upon Arriving at Ben Gurion Airport in TEL AVIV:

- Those with large VAT Tax items, station is at the right.
- The group will enter a queue and wait together.
- Answer security questions.
- Check in at EL AL Airline desks and get boarding pass.
- Proceed to and through Airport Security with carry-on.
- Continue to Passport Control (you have a foreign passport)
- Use the new small slip of paper to enter the walkway.
- When you enter the hub
  - the VAT Tax place walkway to your right.
  - There is the possibility that time may run short and you may not be able to collect your VAT Tax.
- Proceed to your gate and wait to board 12:05 a.m. flight. *Boarding will begin around 11:05*.

#### Return to USA

- We will arrive at EWR around 5:05 AM.
- If you have added MOBILE PASSPORT to your smart phone, you can fill out the preliminary information prior to landing. Do not access it too many times, it will invalidate your entries.
- Take time to make sure you have gathered all of your things and prepared for landing. Check the seatback pockets, under your seat, and the area thoroughly.
- Once you leave the plane you will make the long walk into the ARRIVALS area of the airport.
- If you have MOBILE PASSPORT, enter that line.
- All others proceed to the center of the room and follow the instructions of the security staff.
- Go to a kiosk and complete the necessary steps there and obtain your printout.
- Continue to the next queue and wait to see the Customs Agent.
- Once cleared, go to the luggage claim area and wait until the luggage for your flight arrives.
- When you have gathered your luggage, proceed to your domestic flight Terminal for your return flight home.

There are thin baptismal robes and towels available at Yardenit for a fee of \$10 – 12 I think (and a changing room and hot showers). You will be welcome to use a towel from the hotel for the day near the Dead Sea (where there will also be a changing room and showers). Do consider both of these possibilities. It's truly a once in a lifetime opportunity.

You will have the chance purchase or to order a Holy Land Pilgrimage Cap (sand colored / tan) with Knights Templar Holy Land Pilgrimage Logo embroidered on the front. \$20 if purchased while we are on the trip, \$25 if ordered and to be mailed.

We may have a guest speaker one evening who is a Christian Pastor serving as a pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in the Old City. Is it customary to collect an offering for one of the initiatives he represents as a response to his presentation. Please be generous.

Near the end of the pilgrimage, we will send around a set of envelopes to collect an honorarium for both our Guide and our Bus Driver. Both of these are highly skilled professionals, and you will have grown to appreciate their care and expertise. A standard gratuity is included in the tour package so this is a sort of an appreciation / love offering for these two very special individuals. Please be generous. There may also be an envelope passed around for our ½ day Guide who will serve us in Bethlehem.
